



Learn to think like a middle manager





What makes a good request?

- Clearly defined
- Set date parameters
- Tips on who might have it and how to find it
- Explain your media status
- Cite how you know it exists
- Be creative



Creative requests we've seen:

- Agency intranet pages
- Agency Talking Points
- Get manuals, data inventories, other metadata
- Follow up on little things, official stickers, signs
- Look for annual reports
- "Pre-File"
- Outsourcing Contractors

Other tips:

- Always assume good faith
- Call to make sure they received it
- Let them know when you expect a response
- Interview the response: It can lie, too
- Appeal!



Appealing can be very simple:

Hi,

I'd like to appeal the attached public records rejection, because ...

Sincerely, Sam Reporter

Check out RCFP OGG in advance!



Key Considerations

- Make sure they cite valid exemptions
- Part of document being exempt doesn't mean all of document is exempt: Ask for "segregable" information
- FERPA is not get out of jail free
- A lot of times, you know the law better than they do
